We hope the change of venue to a private home will help alleviate some of that anxiety. Being bisexual in a heterosexist society is difficult. Sometimes we need more help coping with the stress than can be provided in a general discussion night.

Support can take many forms Anyone having questions about this or any other item on the list is invited to call the phone line. We hope the availability of such information, along with sympathetic physicians and lawyers, will add another stone to the foundations of a strong, healthy, vibrant and LIBERATED bisexual community.
