Welcome to the first issue of the Pink Triangle Community Calendar! The PTCC is aimed at increasing the profile, and hopefully the attendance of lesbian and gay events in the cities of Kitchener, Waterloo, Guelph and Cambridge. Event listings are free, and the deadline for the October Calendar is September 20. Each advertising space is approximately 2 inches by 2 1/2 inches, only slightly smaller than an average business card. Ad space is \$10 for one space or \$18 for a double space. Classified ads can also be placed with the PTCC at the cost of \$3 for the first twenty words and 25¢ per word in excess of twenty. Subscriptions are also available for the PTCC at the rate of \$15 per year. Many of these prices are subject to change as we settle in to the process of

running the calendar on a monthly basis, so take advantage of our innocence before we learn how much this calendar will really cost to produce!

Watch this space for news and special features on the organizations that list events with the PTCC. We also invite submissions of poetry, short (very short) stories and articles of interest to the lesbian and gay community.
