### Expressions of Individuality

Surrender Dorothy is K-W's only vintage clothing store, located at the corner of King and Bridgeport in Waterloo. The store sells women's and men's vintage clothing and accessories from the thirties through the sixties.

A woman-owned and women-operated small business, Surrender Dorothy has an advisory committee of women to assist in the business' operations.

The dominant culture of our society advocates conformity in values and appearance, and compliance with these values. Surrender Dorothy supports an alternative culture that encourages creative and diverse expressions of individuality.

In the garment industry, multinationals do not view human rights abuses, child labour law violations, nor oppressive governments as restraints on investing capital in Southern Rim

countries. They depend on the cheap labour of women who make up the majority of workers in the garment industry. In Canada the workers are often recent immigrants.

By supporting the resistance struggles of these workers, ensuring we know where our clothing comes from, and wearing clothing to its full life-span, we can start a new cycle for the garment industry.

Surrender Dorothy places value on clothing beyond one season, saving the 500 gallons of water used to make a cotton outfit for each new event.

From recycled jewelry to androgynous styles, Surrender Dorothy mixes a different time with a different planet
