Lesbian and Gay Pride Day celebrations began on the weekend of June 28, 1969 in New York's Green wich village at the Stonewall Inn. Police detectives had no reason to suspect that this raid would

be anything but routine. A crowd began to gather as staff and customers were escorted out and into paddy wagons. The stars were in their element. Drag queens posed and waved to the crowd as they emerged. Then a bulldyke emerged, struggling from car to door to car again. The crowd exploded and in the ensuing riot gay pride was born. Lesbians and gay men had come together to fight back for the

first time in history.

Today Lesbian and Gay Pride Day is a peaceful, if energetic celebration of lesbian/gay pride and culture. The march, the dances and dancing in the streets, the music and the bands, the sunburns, the arts and crafts. the AIDS memorial, the banners of pride, but best of all...

the people and their love.
