T he Michigan Womyn's Music Festival has been a worldunto itself for 15 years. Every August, more than 7,000 womyn gather on a square mile of wooded, sunsplashed land in central Michigan to build community, work together and see old friends. Oh yes, and to listen to the crème de la crème of Womyn's Music performers. Appearing this year under the tents of Michigan are, among others: Connie Kaldor, Faith Nolan, Two Nice Girls, Lillian Allen, Phranc, Holly Near, Sweet Honey in the Rock, Heather Bishop and Cas-selberry-Duprée. Lavender Jane Loves Womyn, the band that includes some of the pioneers of Womyn's Music, will be reuniting for a one-time only performance. Suffice it to say, whatever your musical taste, you'll find something appealing.

And as if the music wasn't enough, there are workshops on everything from unlearning racism and lesbians in the workplace to spirituality and starting your own business. Participants camp in small groupings and eat communally. The space is divided to accommodate many social

groups, including loud and rowdy, older womyn and chemically-free. There is available support for many kinds of disabilities and interpreters in several spoken languages, as well as American Sign Language. This encampment ends up being, by way of 14 years of experience, as close as anything can get to a perfect womanly world.
