GOOD (Gays Out of Doors) is a discreet social and outdoors activities type of club, dedicated to the people who would like to make social contact and enjoy the fellowship of other gays and lesbians away from bars and the usual "cruise" spots. The warm and friendly attitude of GOOD members suggests a perfect outlet for those who are just coming out. The group is kept non-political and is open to anyone, lesbian, gay or gay-positive who is over the legal age. Children of members are also welcome at most events.

The group started a few years back, fell into abeyance for approximately two years and is now back into action, publishing a calendar of events six times a year. There is usually an event scheduled every week and to date these have been as varied as day hikes along the Bruce Trail, weekend cottage and camping trips, potluck suppers, picnics, barbeques, theatre nights, cycling, swimming, special Christmas and Halloween parties, to name a few. There are meetings held every two months to help lay down the next calendar. These

meetings are open to all and any member can host any event that they choose.

The events that are hosted by members are self-supporting (i.e. cost of food, accommodation, camp fees and transportation are paid for by each individual). There is a membership fee which helps to defer the cost of advertising, postage and the preparation and production of the bi-monthly newsletter: Family \$25, Single \$15 and Student \$10. All membership lists are kept in the strictest confidence by two members and we run our events on a first name basis.

If you wish to attend an event or two to find out what the club is like, please feel free to join us for any event — then make up your mind about joining. You will meet some really great people who just happen to be lesbian and gay.
