## Secrets

The Ontario Ministry of Health and the Ontario AIDS Network have proclaimed October 15-21 as this year's AIDS Awareness Week. The theme for the week will be "OutLiving, OutLoving, OutLasting AIDS." In order to raise community awareness of the disease, and increase compassion and understanding for those infected by the HIV virus, the AIDS Committee of Cambridge, Kitchener-Waterloo and Area (ACCKWA), the Waterloo Region Health Unit AIDS Program and the AIDS Committee of Guelph and Wellington County have arranged a number of educational events for the Waterloo and Guelph/ Wellington regions.

One of the more innovative ideas during AIDS Awareness Week is the presentation of a play called Secrets, at the Humanities Theatre on Monday October 15. Secrets was written by Patricia Loughrey for younger audiences and families. Developed by the Kaiser Permanente Medical Centre of Northern California, this production illustrates how easily AIDS can be transmitted and details methods of prevention.

The show will commence at 8 pm. Admission is free, but ACCKWA will be accepting donations at the theatre and tax receipts are available. Following the show, there will be a question and answer session focussing on the issues in the play with the cast members and ACCKWA's education director.






