CLGRO—The Coalition for Lesbian and Gay Rights in Ontario

Anyone who has been or is involved in a lesbian and gay support group in Ontario has heard of CLGRO. The name is synonymous with organizing, lobbying, networking and strengthening. And anyone who has been or is involved with the Coalition for Lesbian and Gay Rights in Ontario knows that it addresses more than these four objectives.

CLGRO has dealt with provincial issues for over fifteen years. Its achievements are too numerous to list. Among its past successes are: lobbying to include sexual orientation in the Ontario Human Rights Code; honouring outstanding gays and lesbians with the John Damien award; and hosting a popular conference which has continued the fight for same sex relationship recognition in Ontario.

Previous achievements have paved the way for future goals. With its twenty-two member groups and additional members-at-large, CLGRO faces a variety of challenges. It hopes to host a 1991 conference on education issues to combat homophobia;

it plans to launch a handbook on legal issues for gays and lesbians; its working group is drafting legal briefs on benefits for same sex relationships; and it must deal with the ongoing struggle to find funding and volunteer support, in order to turn challenges into result.

Interested in finding out more about CLGRO? GLOW will be hosting the first CLGRO Steering Committee meeting of 1991 on March 2nd and 3rd at the University of Waterloo. Everyone is welcome to participate in the discussion and join in the delegation of CLGRO's full agenda of ongoing projects.
