

International Women's Day (IWD) has a long hisory dating back as early as 1857 when women workers in New York City's garmet sweatshops walked off the job by the thousands to protest twelve hour workdays, poor working conditions, and pitifully low wages. Fifty-one years later on March 8, 1908, after a fire at the Triangle Shirtwaist factory, also in New York, women again walked off the job to protest unsafe working conditions. In 1910, at the Internationalist Socialialist Convention, March 8th was declared International Women's Day and has been celebrated around the world ever since. The modern IWD celebrations encompass a

diversity of issues affecting women's lives such as racism, homophobia, and accessibility for the differently abled. In Kitchener - Waterloo, this year, a week of activities highlight: a day of workshops for women (March 2nd) discussions of women's spirituality (March 3rd and 5th) and Women in the Law and Politics (March 4th and 6th). But don't be fooled, IWD is also a week of celebrations! There's a Women's Craft Fair on March 4th, a Coffeehous on March 7th and two dances on March 8th. Check out the calender inside for details on all these events -- Come on out and enjoy the sprit of International Women's Day 1991!


