AIDS Memorial Quilt Comes to Guelph This Fall

The Aids Committee of Guelph and Wellington County is hosting the only regional exhibit this fall of the Names Project Quilt, a memorial to those who have died of AIDS.

The Quilt presently covers over 10,000 square feet of individual quilts and will be shown at the Armories on Wyndham Street in Guelph on October 4th, 5th and 6th. Opening Ceremonies for the Quilt will be held on October 4th at 7 p.m. The Quilt has travelled across Canada and represents Canadians who have died of AIDS. It was started in 1988 in Canada as a companion to the American quilt which has grown to a size that it cannot be accommodated in most cities.

The Guelph showing of the Quilt will be one of the few occasions the entire Canadian exhibit will be on display since the Armories main hall floor is large enough to fit the panels without any obstructions.

The community is being approached to help raise funds to offset the costs of bringing the Quilt to Guelph. Already the City of Guelph, the United Way and the Ministry of Health have contributed nearly \$5,000 to help the project. More organizations will be approached throughout the next few months. At least \$8,000 is needed by the AIDS Committee to defray costs of the the Quilt memorial. Donations are encouraged from the public between now and October when the Quilt arrives. During the exhibit donations will be accepted.

Nearly 40 volunteers from the Community are already working to organize the Quilts showing in Guelph. Approximately 100 more will be needed.
