Digitized Files - JPEG Version: The JPEG version is of **lower quality** than the PDF version, but will generally be **faster to download** than the PDF version. The files are set so that each page image takes up the full height of your viewing window; increasing the height of your viewing window will increase the size of the text. If your Internet download speed is lower, then this is a better option than the PDF version.

Digitized Files - PDF Version: The PDF version is of higher quality than the JPEG version, but generally takes longer to download than the JPEG version. After the file is displayed, we suggest that you set your viewing window as large as possible and then adjust the PDF magnification so that the text can be read comfortably.



Planning Pride is a lot of work. No one person can do it on his or her own. The WWRP Steering Committee is made up of eight individuals from the local gay and lesbian community.

The Steering Committee members are Craig Hunter (President), Kathy Frey (Vice President), Melody Alderwick (Secretary), Cefn Fforest (Treasurer), Rick Sickinger (Fundraising/ Events Director), and Jay Moore (Promotions & Marketing Director). The Directors At Large are Ron Welker and Suzanne Botsford

Each member of the Steering Committee brings a different area of expertise to the WWRP. Here's a brief snapshot of each Director.

Craig Hunter has done fund-raising locally, nationally and internationally. Educated at the Ontario College of Art and the U of W, he has worked with a wide variety of organizations including the Toronto PWA Foundation, Casev House, the International Court System, and the Names Project (the AIDS Quilt). He is also the Chair for the LGBT Caucus of the Cooperative Housing Federation of Toronto.

Kathy Frey is a Certified Addictions and Body Works Therapist. Kathy

has worked as an individual and group therapist for 15 years. She is currently the owner of Mostly Organic Juice Bar Cafe in downtown Kitchener. Kathy was a volunteer with last year's Pride committee.

Melody Alderwick

recently graduated from the Waterloo Lutheran Seminary with her Masters of Theological Studies, with a focus on women's counseling, in particular lesbian relationships. Melody has volunteered for various community associations and events including last year's Pride Committee.

Cefn Fforest has a long history of advocacy and public awareness in the LGBT and HIV/AIDS communities. His work has included positions on the Board of Directors for a wide variety of groups including ACCKWA, the Ontario AIDS Network and Bread & Roses Co-op. He is also the builder and

designer of the website for Bread & Roses Co-op and edits their newsletter, *The Sheaf*.

Rick Sickinger has spent most of his working life in the non-profit arts sector. This experience combined with the knowledge and skills gained from doing volunteer work within the arts and queer communities allows him to bring a lot of resources to the organization. Rick got involved with the WWRP because he felt there was a real need for a dance to be included as part of the events - he is working towards achieving this goal.

Jay Moore has a fantastic record of fundraising and public awareness in and outside of the LGBT communities. He has worked with a number of organizations including AIDS/HIV agencies across Canada and other non-profit groups.

Ron Welker's past volunteer work includes being the Student Course Rep at the University of Toronto, Art Society Rep and French Club President at the University of Waterloo, time on the Student Council and Library Committee at the UWO Faculty of Education. He maintains membership with the Waterloo Historical Society, Architectural Conservancy of Ontario.
