Hamilton Pride Celebrations this year were overwhelmed with support, whether that support is emotional, financial or political.

As our Queer Community has grown so has the supportive attitude of the City of Hamiltonits elected leaders, its business community and its people. This year we had over 60 local businesses and organizations come on board as sponsors. That's double the number of sponsors we had last year! Hamilton Pride has been thrilled to be working in partnership with the GHLA this year in raising funds for Camp Oasis Canada. Camp Oasis Canada is the first national summer camp just for children infected or affected by the HIV/AIDS virus.

#### Highlights from the Hamilton Pride 2002 Festival:

Hamilton Pride Festival Inc. was elated to have Andrea Horwath (Councillor Ward 2) and Marvin Caplan (Councillor Ward 1) speak at Hamilton Pride's opening event.
