Alison has accompanied the Guelph Chamber Choir and appears on their two latest CDs. She spent several years as an accompanist to the University of Guelph Choir, the Guelph Youth Singers (appearing on its CD), the Elora Festival Choir, as well as numerous freelance engagements. Alison has accompanied us since March 2002.

### Rainbow Chorus, the Waterloo Wellington Chorus of Gays, Lesbians, Bisexuals and Friends Is Celebrating 15 Proud Years of Singing

The Chorus was founded in 1994 by four friends who wanted to build the kind of queer chorus that (**then and now**) only existed in larger urban centres; they also wanted to foster a community of singers, gay and straight, who came together to sing. They were: **Murray Jose** and **Glen Pelshea** and their respective partners **Robert Bojeczko** and **Kevin Fallowfield**.

Rehearsals started in January 1995 and our first self-produced concert was on Saturday, December 9, 1995. We have produced 29 concerts (including this one) in 15 years.

Our community performances include: Spring Fest, weddings, funerals, AIDS Services, Pride Services, Affirmation Services, Hate Crime Vigils, and events such as the re-opening of the YMCA in Guelph, the AGM of the Kitchener Waterloo Sexual Assault Centre, Tsunami Relief, the Hamilton Conference of the United Church of Canada, Action Read, Women in Crisis AGM and seasonal celebrations at the River Run Centre with the Guelph Chamber Choir and a number of church and community choirs.

We have practised and sung at a number of churches in Guelph but our most enduring relationships have been with the Guelph Unitarian Fellowship and Harcourt Memorial United Church.

We have had 5 Artistic Directors: Rob Gascho, John Tute, Rob Phillips, Gordon Burnett and Robert G. Miller. Robert Miller has been our longest serving.

We have had 8 accompanists: Douglas Brownlee, Charmaine Martin, Amy Elder, Ann Marie MacDairmid, Catherine Robertson, Carol Missio-King, Betty Maher and Alison MacNeill.

Currently we have 3 composers/arrangers who have written for the Chorus: Terrilyn Coward, Les Smith and Van Waffle. Tonight we are singing two of those compositions: "Courage" and "Pretty Things".

188 people have sung with the chorus over the past 15 years. We have sung in German, Latin, Romanian, Catalonian, Zulu, Italian, Spanish, Polish, French....and English.

We have ranged in size from 17 to 53 choristers and are currently 45 in number.

Three of tonight's singers (Alan Spreadbury, Leslie Smith and Dave Vervoort) sang in our very first concert.

5 singers have sung more than 20 of the 29 concerts: **Birgit Niggebaum-Purvis** (27), **Les Smith** (26), **Jan Baker** (24), **Marg Perchaluk** (23) and **Dave Vervoort** (21).

We have performed in Guelph, Kitchener, Waterloo, Hamilton, Dundas, London, Toronto, Montreal and on February 19, 2006 we sang at Carnegie Hall in New York City!

We sang at a national choral festival in Toronto in 2002 and at an international choral festival in Montreal in 2004. On the long weekend in May 2010 we are singing at UNISON, a national choral festival in Winnipeg.
