# Pride. Music. Belonging. (Singing OUT! motto)



The story of SingingOUT! is the story of the LGBT community in Toronto over the last two decades. Founded in 1992 by John Schrag, a former member of the Toronto Men's Chorus, SingingOUT! arose out of the the activism of the HIV/AIDS crisis and equal rights struggles of the 1980's and early '90's. This history is reflected in our motto: Pride Music Belonging, and in the song (and title of our Spring 2010 concert) "A Place Where I Belong," by Harry Lewis.

Over the years, we've lent our voices to vigils, memorials, flag-raisings, and Pride celebrations in Toronto, and across North America at the various Unison and GALA Festivals we've attended.

Today, while the struggles of the past may seem like distant history to many of our younger members, we remain faithful to our mission "to promote pride, both in who we are and in musical excellence to the communities where we live, perform, and find mutual support."

**Jody Malone,** Singing *OUT!* 's **Artistic Director** for the last two years, is a graduate of McGill University and the University of Toronto, and has spent her career working as a singer, pianist, educator and choral conductor. Over the years, she has enjoyed conducting women's choirs, jazz choirs and church choirs, and currently teaches full-time at a performing arts school in Mississauga.

**Beth Hanson**, Singing *OUT!* 's **Accompanist**, was enrolled in the Masters of Music Performance program at the University of Western Ontario, and completed her Masters degree while enrolled in the Bachelor of Education program at Lakehead University. She has accompanied instrumentalists, vocalists and choirs extensively and performed to solo recitals in 2007; she is presently a full-time music teacher in Toronto.

# **Starlight**

You tell an old story of perfect love from above but who can measure light of a starry night?

We are all born from dust of ancient suns but who can track their burning through our veins?

You try to give as each person does with varying degrees of grace, imperfectly, 'round the edges.

I've seen no greater power than two pinpoints of fire singing across time and space against all odds.

I don't want your sympathy all I want is freedom to love and grow cosmic as can be.

# Van Waffle's comments about the lyrics:

2004 was an exciting time politically in Canada. Same-sex marriage had recently been legalized in Ontario, Quebec and British Columbia in the course of becoming recognized across Canada. In July I went with the Rainbow Chorus to perform at an international festival of GLBT choirs in Montreal. By coincidence, the theme of our concert performance was "All You Need Is Love". Queer choristers from around the world took advantage of the opportunity to marry legally, regardless of whether their vows would be recognized back home.



I was moved by the exuberance that explodes when people are free to demonstrate their love as they choose. Just as no two people are alike, love never happens the same way twice. It defies rules and definitions. I believe we must move beyond mere tolerance to a society in which we respect diversity and the uniqueness of others.

One song we performed at the festival was "All I Ask Of You" from Andrew Lloyd Webber's musical, Phantom of the Opera. One phrase, "All I want is freedom/A world with no more night," emerged for me as a challenge to anyone who would suggest my love is not good enough. I came home from Montreal with this thought: "All I want is freedom to love to the best of my understanding." That is where the poem "Starlight" began.

One of my favourite things to do is sit outside at night, beside a quiet lake far from the city, during the dark of the moon when all the whole brilliant galaxy shines clear overhead. And yet all the stars I can see are a tiny drop in the bucket of the universe. It is a humbling experience. The love I feel for my children and family, my friends and lovers, might not amount to much in the grand scheme, but of all things it has the most power to transform my life. I will not hide it away.

A native of Kingston and a graduate of Queen's University, Mark Sirett holds both masters and doctoral degrees in conducting and pedagogy from the University of Iowa. He taught at the University of Alberta, Bucknell University, the University of Western Ontario, before returning to Queen's. For six years he served as Organist/Choirmaster of St. George's Cathedral, Kingston during which time the Girl Choristers under his direction won the 1996 CBC Choral Competition in the church choir category.

Dr. Sirett is currently the Artistic Director of the Cantabile Choirs of Kingston, an award-winning multi-choir educational programme that records and tours internationally.

Dr. Sirett is also an award-winning composer with over 50 published choral works in Canada, the US, Britain and Sweden. His compositions have been performed by some of Canada's leading ensembles including the National Youth Choir of Canada, Toronto Children's Chorus, the Amabile Youth Singers, Elora Festival Singers, and the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir. Recent commissions include major works for the University of Iowa, Minneapolis Choir Festival, the Kingston Symphony Association, and the Waterloo District High School Choral Festival. He frequently serves as an adjudicator and clinician throughout the country.
