This Just In: Rainbow Flags—On May 26, Kitchener City Council approved a new flag policy allowing community groups to have their flags flown on one of two community flagpoles; this replaces a 1995 policy banning community flags from being flown by the City. On May 27, the **Region of Waterloo** approved the flying of the rainbow flag on their Frederick St flagpole for May 29—June 7 & June 12. Two firsts for our local community!
