Charitable Status

SPECTRUM was registered with the government of Ontario as a not-forprofit corporation in 2013. With three years of financial reports behind us now, SPECTRUM has begun the process of applying for charitable status.

This is a two-stage process. We have recently been approved by the government of Ontario for charitable status. We expect to receive the documentation from Service Ontario before August.

The second stage is applying to the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) for charitable status. The documentation that Service Ontario will be sending us will form part of the basis for our request, but CRA asks for a lot more information. Our website at www.ourspectrum.com We have been led to believe that completing this stage might take between

eight and ten more months. The good tion to be able to issue income-tax redonations to SPECTRUM—some time early in 2017.

Aging with Pride Committee

For the past twelve months, the Aging with Pride Committee has been creating and delivering LGBTQ-competency training sessions to staff at a variety of senior-serving institutions in Waterloo-Wellington, such as: community centres with a significant senior population, retirement homes, home-care services, long-term-care facilities, and hospices.

This work is critical if we want to ensure that institutions like the above are places where we will be treated with dignity and respect when we need them something that is currently not always the case.

Newcomer Services

LGBTQ-identified newcomers to Canada (immigrants, refugees and students) are often very uncomfortable with the local immigrant population from their countries of origin. As a result, they can feel quite isolated. SPECTRUM provides a safe space for them, and can also assist in referrals to LGBTQ-friendly resources and settlement agencies.
