## A Spare Room; a World of Difference by Rachel III, Homes Host Co-ordinator

oneROOF Youth Services is excited for our new Host Homes Program! We are looking for LGBTQ2S+ positive spaces for youth who are experiencing, or are at risk of homelessness. The new pilot project aims to prevent shelter stay by collaborating with local households or "Host Home Providers" as a means of arranging temporary, well-supported room and board situations for youth ages 16-25.

The Canadian Observatory on Homelessness (2017) based out of Toronto, estimates that over 20-40 per cent of youth experiencing homelessness identify as LGBTQ2S+, taking into account that many may not feel comfortable disclosing. sWhen a young person loses their home, the thing they need the most is a stable, secure environment. Our Host Homes program aims to provide that opportunity, so that youth can think about what next steps might be, rather than their immediate needs of survival.

Our goal is to bring together a great group of Host Home Providers reflective of the audience we serve, with different sets of values and experiences, so that when a young person comes to us, we will have a place where they will feel welcome while we work with them to find longer-term housing.
