Each chorus member pays a one-time music deposit of \$25 (separate from your membership dues). This deposit is to help the Chorus defray the cost of music in the event of loss or damage. If a member decides to leave the Chorus, the deposit will be refunded as long as all music is returned and in good condition.

Membership Dues

The cost of membership is \$100 per term and there is a sliding scale based on affordability of \$25-\$100. (Non-singing dues: \$25 minimum)
