Purpose: The Waterloo-Wellington LGBTQ communities have not had a composite resource directory since publication of the *Rainbow Directory 2001/2002* by Waterloo-Wellington Regional Pride [the earlier name of the tri-Pride Community Association]. The *Rainbow Pages – Waterloo-Wellington* is intended to fill that gap.

Scope: In this edition, we are restricting resources to groups, agencies and professionals who offer services likely to be of interest to the local LGBTQ communities. In subsequent editions we expect to broaden the scope to include commercial establishments that do not offer professional services. NOTE: The only resources that we include that are not based in Waterloo-Wellington are Ontario-wide service agencies.

Audience: This publication has two target audiences: (1) members of the **local LGBTQ communities** who are interested in learning about resources that are available to them, and (2) professionals in the **local service agencies** who would like to be able to refer clients of theirs appropriately.

Origins: Initial gathering of this data began August 2012, when SPECTRUM – Waterloo Region’s Rainbow Community Space first opened its doors. The information was placed at first on a bulletin board in the SPECTRUM Office. When SPECTRUM spun off from the Waterloo Region Rainbow Coalition in February 2013, SPECTRUM created its own website with the directory information online as part of the website. With time, the number of categories in the online directory grew and the amount of information increased.

In July 2014, SPECTRUM decided that it would be useful to publish a condensed version of the online directory – retaining every entry, but shortening each one to a manageable form. Additional information was gathered by sending review copies to local professionals in the social service sector. Edition 1.0 was published 2014, October.

Format: The publication is in booklet format (8.5" x 5.5"). Directory entries are grouped into categories, which are arranged alphabetically.

Availability: SPECTRUM is making Edition 2.2 available only in electronic format. The most recent version is found at <http://ourspectrum.com/resources/rainbow-directory/>. Once we have secured sufficient advertising funds, we will create Edition 3.0, which will be available in print form as well as electronic form.

Survey of Gender-Neutral Washrooms in Waterloo Region

PURPOSE: SPECTRUM is working on a survey of gender-neutral washrooms in Waterloo Region. Anyone who is trans-identified is well aware of the need for this sort of information - the problem being that folks who do not clearly conform to the gender with which they identify can encounter hostility (**gender-policing**) when they use the washroom of their choice. The existence of single usage washrooms that are NOT labelled by gender makes life much easier for trans-identified individuals.

WHAT IT COVERS: SPECTRUM is surveying **public institutions**, where there is no expectation that you will have to pay money to use the washrooms. These public institutions include government buildings/offices, recreational centres, community centres, libraries, shopping malls, large health centres and hospitals, among others. We are also surveying **selected businesses** (like cafes and restaurants), where there is often some expectation that you will make some expenditure in order to use their washrooms.

DATA INCLUDED: We aim to include: the **name** of the institution/business, the **address**, the **number** of gender-neutral washrooms (e.g. 2 one-stall washrooms), and the **location within the building** (if it is a large building).

PHASE 1: is the production of a survey to provide **much needed information** for the local trans community. **The results (with a Google map) are at:** <http://ourspectrum.com/projects/gender-neutral-restrooms/> It lists over 100 establishments, several of which have more than one gender-neutral washroom. PHASE 2: will involve a campaign to **encourage** public institutions and businesses that do not have any gender-neutral washrooms to follow the examples of other local public institutions and businesses listed in the survey. In some cases, this should be easy. For example, many cafes have single-usage washrooms that are labelled by gender; removing the gender designations would not be difficult.
